People of the State of Michigan v. Daniel Ray Bean

SUMMARY

Michigan Supreme Court order directing the Muskegon Circuit Court to determine whether defendant Daniel Ray Bean is indigent and, if so, to appoint attorney Mary Chartier as counsel under Administrative Order 2003-03. The order addresses indigency determination and appointment of counsel in a criminal appeal. No substantive legal issues were decided.
