SUMMARY

The Fourteenth Court of Appeals of Texas denied a petition for writ of mandamus filed by Linda Hernandez and the other relators. The relators sought to compel the trial court to vacate orders concerning a motion to compel and objections to requests for production, but the court held that they had not established entitlement to extraordinary relief.

In the petition, relators ask this court to compel the Honorable Susan Criss, presiding judge of the 212th District Court of Galveston County, to vacate her April 20, 2012 order denying relators' motion to compel, and her December 12, 2011 order sustaining David Salyer's objections to relators' requests for production.

Relators have not established entitlement to the extraordinary relief of a writ of mandamus. Accordingly, we deny relators' petition for writ of mandamus. PER CURIAM Panel consists of Justices Frost, Jamison, and McCally. 2
