HOLDINGS

1. The sentence was not excessive.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The opinion identifies Joseph Montesquie as the defendant-appellant and states that he appealed from a judgment of the Supreme Court, Bronx County, rendered on October 15, 2024. The Appellate Division addressed whether the sentence was excessive and found that it was not.
