People of Commerce Township v. Ljupco Sekulovski

No. SC: 159956, Michigan Supreme Court (June 30, 2020)

SUMMARY

Michigan Supreme Court denied leave to appeal in a municipal prosecution by Commerce Township against Ljupco Sekulovski, leaving the Court of Appeals order from June 5, 2019, undisturbed. The Court was not persuaded that the questions presented warranted review. No substantive holdings or legal rules were issued.
