SUMMARY

The Thirteenth Court of Appeals of Texas granted the parties' joint motion to dismiss an appeal after they reached a settlement. The appeal was dismissed, costs were taxed against the appellant, and the court stated that no motion for rehearing would be entertained and that its mandate would issue immediately.

HOLDINGS

1. The court granted the parties' joint motion and dismissed the appeal.
2. Costs were taxed against the appellant.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The parties reached an agreement to settle and compromise their differences while the appeal was pending. They jointly moved for dismissal of the appeal based on that agreement.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The appeal was taken from the 398th District Court of Hidalgo County, Texas. After the parties settled, they jointly requested dismissal of the appeal, which the court granted.
