SUMMARY

The United States District Court for the Southern District of New York entered civil judgment dismissing Christian Jusino's action against Doe for the reasons stated in a December 1, 2025 order. The court certified under 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a)(3) that an appeal would not be taken in good faith and denied in forma pauperis status for purposes of appeal.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

- Whether the action should be dismissed for the reasons stated in the court's December 1, 2025 order.

HOLDINGS

1. The action is dismissed for the reasons stated in the court's December 1, 2025 order.
2. Any appeal from the judgment would not be taken in good faith, so in forma pauperis status is denied for purposes of an appeal.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND
