SUMMARY

The court notes that the plaintiff failed to file the required in forma pauperis affidavit and certified inmate trust account statement within the ordered period. The magistrate judge recommends dismissing the action without prejudice and advises the plaintiff of the deadline and consequences for filing objections.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

- Whether the action should be dismissed without prejudice after plaintiff failed to comply with the order requiring submission of documents supporting his in forma pauperis request.

HOLDINGS

1. The magistrate judge recommended that the action be dismissed without prejudice because plaintiff failed to submit the required affidavit and certified inmate trust-account statement after being given thirty days to do so.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Plaintiff sought to proceed in forma pauperis. The court ordered him to file a completed supporting affidavit and a certified copy of his inmate trust-account statement for the six-month period preceding the complaint. The thirty-day deadline expired without plaintiff responding or filing either required document.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The court previously granted plaintiff thirty days to file a completed affidavit supporting his request to proceed in forma pauperis and a certified inmate trust-account statement for the preceding six months. Plaintiff did not respond or file the required documents after the deadline expired. The magistrate judge ordered assignment of a district judge and recommended dismissal without prejudice, subject to objections within fourteen days.
